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PREFACE

I am happy to note that Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (OUIDF) under Housing and Urban Development Department is bringing out its 8th Annual Report for the years 2020-21 and 2021-22.

Odisha has made significant achievements in terms of economic growth, poverty reduction and other socio-economic indicators. The State Government has also conceptualized as well as articulated development strategy with special emphasis on Poverty reduction, Urban Infrastructure and Human Development with inclusive growth for reduction of regional disparities with effective delivery mechanism.

Odisha's economy has grown steadily at the rate of 7.1% between 2012-13 and 2019-20, faster than National average of 6.6%. However, there was a contraction in the State economy by 5.3% (A.E.) in 2020-21 primarily because of the devastating impact of the Pandemic COVID-19. But for the resilience of the State Economy and effective Governance Measures in managing the Pandemic, while the declining growth has been arrested (AE) in 2021-22, the State Economy is likely to grow by 10% as against National Average of 8.8%. The rebound in growth is attributed to robust growth in manufacture sector.

Urban Infrastructure is a pre-requisite for economic growth of a State. Providing critical essential social infrastructure like drinking water, sanitation, sewerage, solid waste management, slum rehabilitation, etc. are major challenges today. The Rebound in growth is attribute to robust growth in manufacture. The effective implementation of existing and new policies of the State, could overcome the global slowdown, inflationary pressure and natural shocks etc. to attain a sound growth rate.

Keeping in view the above objectives, OUIDF has availed Loan from KfW, Development Bank of Germany amounting to 50 Million Euro (Rs. 420 crore approx.) as 1st Line of Credit and 55 Million Euro (Rs. 480 crore approx.) as 2nd Line of Credit and so far disbursed Rs. 685.21 crore (Loan Rs. 367.07 crore and Grant Rs.318.14 crore) for 53 nos. of Projects with a Total Project Cost of Rs.2747.90 crore. During the years 2020-21 and 2021-22, a sum of Rs. 54.27 crore has been disbursed along with disbursement of Rs. 7.84 crore from own funds under 2nd Line of Credit. The Projects include Sewerage System, Solid Waste Management (SWM), Abattoir, Reclamation of Water Body, Wet Market, Water Supply, Affordable Housing and Energy Efficient Street Lighting Projects, etc. Various Project Development Activities in sectors such as SWM, Sewerage System, Water Body, etc. have enabled to promote Bankable Projects.

I am sure with the initiative taken by Govt. of Odisha and assistance of KfW, Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (OUIDF) will keep up the expectations of the ULBs, Statutory Bodies paving way in establishing "Eco-friendly Urban Infrastructure Projects" in the State.

My compliments to the Trust and its inmates for bringing out the Annual Report of OUIDF for the year 2020-21 and 2021-22.

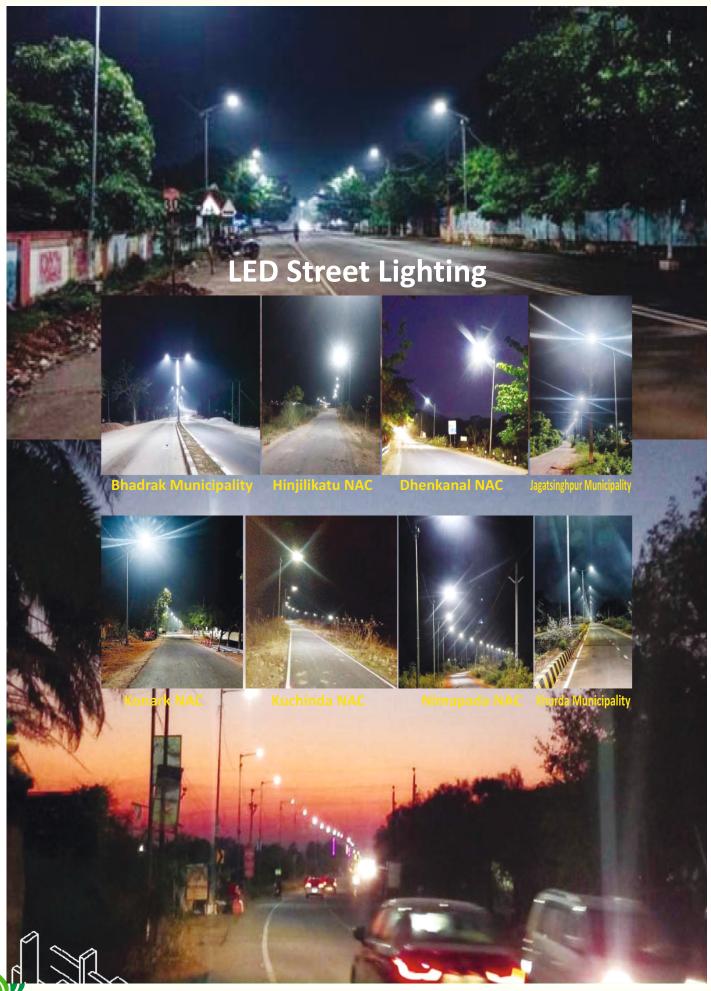

CHAPTER-1

BACKGROUND

Globalization and Liberalization have already proved to be the prime movers of the economic progress. This in turn has contributed to rapid urbanization all over the Globe. Adequate, desired quality & sustainable urban infrastructure is therefore an inescapable necessity and an inseparable ingredient concomitant to the ongoing process of economic development. The urban India today faces the serious challenge of providing a cost effective & optimal solution to attain this objective. Provision of critical social infrastructure like drinking water, sanitation, sewerage, solid waste management, slum rehabilitation etc. have indeed become the prime concern for a developing Nation.

Infrastructure Development is a vital component in enhancing the economic growth. Development of infrastructure enhances the productivity, sustainability, consequently making economic activities more competitive while boosting the economy. Odisha is no exception to the above cardinal principle. With increasing share of urban areas in the State, the thrust of the State Government has shifted to development of urban infrastructure with special emphasis on providing basic civic services and amenities for the entire urban population.

Odisha's economy has undergone a structural change during the past decade. With the increasing share of Urban areas vis-a-vis population, urban management poses biggest challenge for developing quality infrastructure that can sufficiently respond to market demand for basic services and economic activities. As such Infrastructure services are in demand. The State Government continues its efforts to improve the spread and quality of social infrastructure for a better quality of life through several programmes and projects.

Odisha's economy has grown steadily between 2012-13 and 2019-20 at the rate of 7.1%, faster than the National Average of 6.6%. The growth rate of the State in 2020-21 is estimated at a declining rate of (-) 5.3% due to the devastating impact of the Pandemic COVID-19. However, the declining trend has been arrested along with an estimated growth rate for 2021-22 at 10.1% (A.E).

Government of Odisha has been actively participating in the Country's efforts towards achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Odisha is one of the leading States in the Country for initiating various urban reforms with an aim to improve service delivery, mobilize resources, transparent municipal functioning and accounting system. As per the rankings made by NITI Aayog for the Indian States in respect of SDG goals, Odisha is among the performer States in terms of no poverty, zero hunger, good health & wellbeing, clean water & sanitation, reduction of inequality, sustainable cities & communities indexes. Odisha is ranked 4th in 'industry, innovation and infrastructure'. The Government is committed to pursue the vision of taking its economy to the next level by use of Five Ts i.e. Technology, Teamwork, Transparency and Time leading to Transformation to a developed State.





1.1. Overview of Urban Odisha

Infrastructure Development is a vital necessity, being the prime mover of economic progress across all sectors of the economy contributing to inclusive growth thereby benefiting people in reducing Poverty and improving their Quality of Life. Urbanisation is the process of economic, spatial, and social transformation over a period of time involving people from all strata of the society.

As of now, the number of Urban Local Bodies and other Para-statals in Odisha are as under:

Municipal Corporations - 5	Municipalities - 48	Notified Area Councils - 62
Development Authorities - 9	Special Planning Authorities - 52	Regional Improvement Trusts - 7

The above entities cover an estimated urban population over 70 lakhs (Census-2011), with the decadal growth rate of 26.94%.

The Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) need to play a major role in mobilizing resources for infrastructure development in the cities. The Housing & Urban Development (H & UD) Department of Government of Odisha is responsible for ensuring proper and planned growth of cities and towns with adequate infrastructure, amenities and services to be provided to the citizens through the Urban Local Bodies and Parastatal Agencies.

1.2. Urban Infrastructure Development

An adequate and good infrastructure is a pre-requisite for the accelerated development which propels higher economic growth as a whole. Utmost efforts are being made for substantially improving the extent and quality of infrastructure in the State.

The State Government continues with its unstinted efforts to improve the spread and quality of social infrastructure like Water Supply, Sanitation, Sewerage, Solid Waste Management, Climate Adaptation Measures, Slum Rehabilitation through Affordable Housing, Storm Water Management and other allied eco-friendly activities for a better quality of life through several programs and projects.

Urban Infrastructure, a key for development, is solely dependent on striking the right balance of urban development alongside the infrastructure. The United Nations Sustainable Development Goal-11 (SDG) states: "Make Cities Inclusive, Safe, Resilient and Sustainable" embarking on a fast Rural to Urban transmission with achievement of goal in Urban Infrastructure and its challenges.

Odisha continues to be among the least urbanized States with an urban population of about 17%, while nearly 31% of India's current population live in urban areas according to Census 2011. However, the pace of urbanization in Odisha continues to be intensified due to rapid industrialization and good economic performance, which has led to impressive growth in several fields as reflected below:





- a) Urban population grew 26.8% during 2001-2011 which is double the National Growth vis-à-vis Rural Population growth of 11.7% during the same period. In Odisha around 70 lakh people live in Urban Areas out of 4.20 cr. population as per 2011 census. Our State had over 2 million migrants to its urban areas.
- b) The number of towns have increased from 138 in 2001 to 223 in 2011 (largely due to increase in census towns from 31 to 116, even though Statutory Towns remained at 114).
- c) Budgetary outlay of Housing & Urban Development Deptt. (H&UDD) has increased substantially during the last decade (around 30 times) in the year 2020-21 (BE Rs. 6180 crore) & 2021-22 (BE Rs. 5803 crore) as compared to 2005-06 (BE Rs 101 crore).
- d) However, "Municipal Finances" are weak. Capital Investments continue to rely on Government of Odisha (GoO)'s budgetary support and grants. Debt Financing is limited to State supported Projects and constrained by inadequate capacity to develop Bankable Projects.
- e) The Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) need to play a major role in mobilizing resources for infrastructure development in cities. The weak financial base of the ULBs being their major constraint, limits their spending on infrastructure services. The ULBs therefore need to exploit potential, cost effective & non- conventional means of resources mobilization to achieve their social welfare objectives. As a result, this will boost inclusive and overall development of cities/ towns into livable, economically vibrant, sustainable and efficient entities with provision of adequate and durable public infrastructure and amenities in a convergent manner.
- f) Even though the Municipal legal framework allows flexibility to access loans at the ULB level, Debt Financing for the Urban Projects through multi-lateral and bilateral financing may derive the following benefits:
- Integrated approach to Urban Development with access to fixed, low interest long-term funds and technical assistance to build expertise in implementing "Bankable Projects".
- Leveraging Government interventions and available subsidies under various Programmes contribute to the higher economy scale in operations of feasible Projects.
- Introducing ULBs to the rigour of Debt Servicing discipline leading to gradual reduction of dependence on budgetary support.
- Procurement adopting International Guidelines of Multilateral Agencies.
- Greater scope for private sector participation in asset creation and service delivery.
- Capacity Building of ULBs through professional support out of various Technical Assistance Grant.

1.3. Urban Transformation: Initiatives taken by the State

The H & UD Department has undertaken various initiatives for urban transformation of Odisha in line with the vision of the Government for achieving the SDGs. The major programmes are given below:



1.3.1. Slum Development and Land Rights to Slum Dwellers

Poverty and homelessness forces the poor families to settle in slum habitations in urban areas. These habitations are usually densely populated and devoid of basic sanitation & hygiene facilities, raising concerns over health, education and standard of living. As per 2011 census, 15.60 lakhs population of 3.50 lakhs (Latest slum HHS stands at 4.12 lakhs) households live in

slum areas. Total slum population of the State constitutes 3.72% of the total population and 22% of the total urban population of Odisha. Odisha had a comparatively low population of slum proportion at 3.72% of the total population.

In this regard, Act and Rules formulated and notified for grant of land/ property rights in Municipalities, NACs and Municipal Corporations (Municipal Corporations are not included under the Odisha Land Rights to Slum Dwellers Act, 2017, it is applicable to Municipalities and NACs only). Further, 109 Urban Areas Slums Redevelopment and Rehabilitation Committee formed across the State, in 2,919 slums to transform the living conditions of 400,000 (4,12,000) families with 1.7 million people.



Within last two years, 1725 slums were mapped, 2919 SDAs (Slum Dwellers Association) were formed, 181,000 (1,72,656) households were surveyed, 60,000 (80,555) households granted Land Rights, 92,101 households granted Land Entitlement Certificate and out of 40,622 households, that are approved for housing assistance, around 15,000 houses were built. Government has initiated slum upgradation and delisting activities in September 2020 with an objective of transforming 2919 slums into 'Adarsh Colony' ('Biju Adarsh Colony') in three years' time.

1.3.2. Urban Housing

The Odisha Urban Housing Mission (OUHM) was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha on 11th October, 2015 recognizing the need for an effective and efficient institutional mechanism to achieve the objectives of "Housing for All" in urban areas.



Based on the estimates of the Housing for All Plan of Action (HFAPOA) prepared by OUHM, there is housing shortage for 5, 02,175 households out of which only 89,418 households hold land titles and the rest are landless. Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY)-Urban is a major programme implemented in urban areas to meet the housing shortage.





A total of 1,62,037 houses in 114 ULBs have been sanctioned out of which 1,24,277 houses have been grounded. About 20,576 houses have been sanctioned under Affordable Housing in partnership and in situ Slum Rehabilitation out of which 11,784 houses have been grounded. Odisha Urban Housing Mission (OUHM) has been working with JAGA Mission to ensure that land rights and housing is made available to the slum dwellers and to transform the slums into liveable habitats. 43,849 households, that received land right certificates, have already been sanctioned houses under PMAY - (Urban). Further Investment amounting to Rs. 877 cr has been estimated for implementation of "JAGA" Mission to cater to a demand of 2 lakh houses.

1.3.3. Urban Power: Energy Efficient Smart LED Street Lighting Project.

In an effort by the Govt., as a key intervention to illuminate all public streets in the 114 ULBs of Odisha with Energy Efficient LED Lamps, Projects have been initiated across all 114 ULBs over the last couple of years. Approximately 89,824 Energy Efficient Street Lights have been installed in the Municipal Corporations. The Govt. has also initiated a special drive to "Retrofit Street Lights"

with EESL at 109 ULBs. In the second phase, 2,57,716 street lights have been installed against the target of 2,38,000. In the third phase, Government has identified 61,079 light points at uncovered streets/roads in all ULBs and has refitted 44,027 with LED lighting under the Green Field Street Lighting Project. The estimated capital outlay for the on-going Public Street Lighting Projects aggregate to around Rs. 580 crore. Replacement of



Conventional lights with LED luminaires entail substantial energy savings and hence reduced energy bills for the ULBs.

1.3.4. Smart City

Bhubaneswar Smart City Limited (BSCL), which was incorporated in 2016, aims to promote Bhubaneswar as a live-able city that gives a better quality of life to its citizens with a clean and sustainable environment; to enter into contracts, partnerships and service delivery arrangements with Indian as well as foreign firms, as may be required for the implementation of



the Smart Cities Mission; to undertake comprehensive development by promoting mixed land use, provision of housing for all, the creation of walk-able localities, preserving and developing open spaces, promoting a variety of transport options including transit-oriented development, public transport & last mile para-transport connectivity, making governance, citizen friendly and cost effective, giving identity to the city and applying smart solutions to infrastructure and





services in order to make them better; to undertake the review of activities of the Mission including budget, implementation of projects under Smart City Proposal (SCP) and co-ordination with other missions/schemes and activities of various Ministries / Departments.

Area based development and Pan-City solution are two major components of Smart City Proposal (SCP). Area based development focuses on comprehensive development of a selected area within the city where as Pan-City solution focuses on spreading of technological intervention to entire city catering to smart solution of citizens.

By 2020-21, two Infrastructure Projects have been completed out of 9 Projects taken up. Six Infrastructure Projects such as BMC—Intelligent City Operations & Management Centre (ICOMC) Building, Smart Janapath, Multi-Level Car Parking (MLCP) at Saheed Nagar, Multi-Level Car Parking (MLCP) at Rajmahal Square, are in the implementation stage and are expected to be completed by end of this year 2021-22

Achievements: - By implementation of Smart Janapath Project, Systematic Street Parking for four wheelers and two wheelers has been ensured. travel time has been reduced, substantially and systematic discharge of rain water has reduced water logging during heavy rain thereby urban flood has been avoided. Implementation of ATSC and MSI Project has resulted in better Traffic Management, detection of Traffic Violation, Online Services of Building Plan,



Grievance Redressals, Trade License, Property Tax and Holding Tax etc. Tracking of Mo Buses, Ambulances, PCR & BMC Vehicles in Bhubaneswar.

1.3.5. Urban Water Supply: Universal Coverage of Drinking Water Supply

Government of Odlsha have emphasized on Improving the level of Urban Drinking Water Service In order to ensure more equitable, efficient and sustainable Urban Water Supply System. The State has given a mandate for Universal Coverage with Adequate and Quality Drinking Water Supply and Equitable access to the services by all categories of people at their door step through individual house hold connection.

- In the year 2015-16, a quantity of 914.18 MLD was being supplied which has been increased to 1256.84 MLD by the year ending March, 2022.
- In the year 2015-16, only 12 Urban Local Bodies were being supplied at the rate of more than 135 litters of water per head per day (lpcd), now it has been increased to 55 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs).







- In the year 2015-16, 56 Urban Local Bodies were being supplied at the rate between 70 to 135 liters of water per head per day (lpcd), now due to enhanced coverage through universal coverage projects, it has been realigned to 52 Urban Local Bodies (ULBs).
- In the year 2015-16, 44 ULBs were being supplied at the rate of less than 70 liters of water per head per day (lpcd), now it has been reduced to only 7 ULBs.
- During 2021-22, 113 Nos. of Water Supply Projects have been completed under State's Flagship Programme "BASUDHA" along with various other schemes like; UIDSSMT, AMRUT, DMF, OMBADC to ensure universal coverage of piped water supply and provision of 100% household connections for all areas in all 114 ULBs.

Achievements during 2021-22:

- \$ 1,327 Kms. of new Distribution Pipeline has been laid making total of 12891 Kms.
- 1,33,678 Nos. of new Household Water Supply Connections provided making total of 9,76,101 Nos.
- Achieved 100% House Hold Connections for 65 ULBs making a total of 84 ULBs.
- 384 Wards fully covered with piped water supply making a total of 1871 Wards.
- 105 Mliiion Liters of additional storage capacity added with newly constructed 113 Nos. of ESRs and 73 Nos. of GSRs making a total of 877.78 Million Liters.
- 113 Urban Water Supply Projects completed during this year making a total of 453 Nos.
- The cumulative coverage of 97% habitations and 96% of Urban Population was achieved during this year.

Achievements under AMRUT Scheme:

- Under the National Flagship Programme of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), the following progress has been made in Odisha.
- Out of 130 Water Supply Projects with a total cost of Rs.1557.09 crore, 125 Projects have been completed at a cost of Rs.1450.36 crore till date.
- 165.25 Kms. Of water supply distribution pipelines have been replaced/laid in Nine AMRUT Cities during this financial year.
- Out of 1,88,351 households, water supply pipeline connections have been provided to all the households in Nine AMRUT Cities.
 - In order to strengthen the community participation in the urban water supply management and effective generation & collection of revenue from water charges, "Jalasathis" from the local Women Self Help Groups (WSHGs) are being engaged under ST programme of Government of



Odisha. So far 740 Nos. of Jalasathis have been trained & deployed in 105 Nos. of urban local bodies (ULBs) of the State.

1.3.6. Drink From Tap

Mission "Drink from Tap" is a Comprehensive Mission that will critically examine risk management for continuous water supply from catchment to consumer and also enables consumers to directly drink from tap.

The Drink from Tap Mission along with Metering and 24 X 7 water supply has been completed in

five pilot zones at Bhubaneswar and Puri and one sub-pilot zone at Bhubaneswar.

Water Corporation of India (WATCO) has started unique reform initiative i.e. Jalasathi in Bhubaneswar and Puri. It aims to connect more than 12 lakh households with the help of 5000 Jalasathi from Women Self-Help Group (WSHG) across the State in a phased manner.

"Water Supply to Greater Berhampur with Janivili as source" was taken up by the Government under State Plan in convergence with funding from AMRUT and OUIDF with an investment of Rs. 431.30 crore.



1.3.7. Urban Road Transport: Capital Region Urban Transport

Capital Region Urban Transport (CRUT) is a Special Purpose Vehicle of Housing and Urban Development Department, Government of Odisha. It evolved from Bhubaneswar Puri Transport Services Ltd. (BPTSL) in 2018 to revolutionise the public transport scenario in the capital region of Odisha by making its services customer-centric. CRUT began its journey with the city bus services known as "Mo Bus" which was implemented to strengthen the public transport system in the capital region of the State under Bhubaneswar City Bus Modernisation Plan (BCBMP). The Mo Bus service of CRUT plies across Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Khordha, Pipili, Puri and Konark; serving its citizens with inclusive, sustainable, safe and affordable public transport. Currently there are

265 Mo Buses (including 10 E-Buses) plying across 492 km network, covering 34 routes serving approximately more than 1.5 lakh commuters per day.

With the Mission to attain several Sustainable Development Goals, CRUT came up with the E-Rickshaw – Mo E-Ride services having women, transgender and socially disadvantaged people as drivers – "Sarathis". Like Mo Bus, Mo E-Ride is also integrated with smart technology to provide its



commuters with seamless service. This one of its kind initiative would contribute towards improving the environmental quality, providing first and last mile connectivity by providing feeder service to the existing Mo Bus service and most importantly enhance gender and social inclusivity.



CRUT has two State-of-the-Art-Depots located at Patia and Bhagabanpur. Three more depots are under construction at Gadakana, Pokhariput and Naraj. There are four functional Origin-Destination (OD) Terminals that are functional. The OD Terminal at Chandrasekharpur has been revamped recently with provision for charging infrastructure.

It is a matter of pride for CRUT to have won Urban Mobility India (UMI) award organised by Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA), Government of India every year since its inception. CRUT was bestowed with the 'Award for Excellence in Urban Transport under the category of State which has Implemented Best Urban Transport Projects during the previous year' in UMI 2021.

In 2022, CRUT was awarded the United Nations Public Service Awards 2022 for Promoting Gender-Responsive public services to achieve the SDGs for the initiative "Mo Bus" by United Nations. CRUT also bagged the Smart Solutions Challenge & Inclusive Cities Awards 2022 for Implemented Solutions under the theme Mobility and Transportation by National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) and United Nations – India. Additionally, in 2021, CRUT also received the Smart Cities India Awards 2021 under the category 'Smart (SPV) Special Purpose Vehicle' by Smart Cities India Expo and was also bestowed with the accolade of Corona Samman Warrior for 'Exemplary and Inspiring Services during the pandemic of COVID-19' by Prelude Novel Ventures Pvt. Ltd.

With the overwhelming response of the public and demand from its commuters, CRUT plans to expand its services in the Capital Region of Odisha by adding 100 midi buses and 100 mini buses in its service.

1.3.8. Urban Sanitation

State Government have initiated multipronged approach to achieve Swachha Odisha, accelerate the universal sanitation consciousness to make Odisha open defecation free and improve levels

of cleanliness through solid and liquid waste managements. Main thrust areas - Elimination of open defecation by providing Individual House Hold Latrine (IHHL), Community Toilets (C.T.), Hybrid Toilets and Public Toilets. Modern and Scientific Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) Management, effect behavioral change in adopting healthy sanitation practices, generate awareness about sanitation and its linkage with public health, capacity building of all stake holders of ULB, All the 114 ULBs were declared as "Open Defecation Free(ODF) and 67 ULBs as ODF+ & 21 ULBs as ODF++.



Special Recognition – Urban category for the Indian Sanitation Coalition (ISC) FICCI Award, 2019, was received by the State Government, for outstanding achievement in Swachha Survekshan



2019 by Government of India as fastest moving cities.

1.3.9. JAGA Mission

With coverage of approximately 1.8 million population covering all the 114 ULBs, this is one of the largest initiatives taken by Government to reduce vulnerability of the urban poor by



increasing tenure security (and provisioning of basic facilities for a decent life). It is realized that slum dwellers are the lifeline of the city and the State cannot be developed without their upliftment. The main objective is to transform the existing slums into liveable habitats. The Hon'ble Chief Minister launched Odisha Livable Habitats Mission (Jaga Mission) to promote sustainable development of habitats with a view to ensuring equitable supply of land, shelter and services at affordable prices to all sections of urban poor. Today, roughly one-in-four people living in Odisha's urban areas live in slums, where residents have no land rights and no security of tenure. Without this, they are excluded from basic services, unable to enroll children in school, open bank account or access a range of Government benefits and schemes.

Four pronged strategies have been adopted by the Government to achieve the following objective-

- Grant of Land rights to all households living in slums in all urban areas.
- Transforming the living conditions in slums with basic civic services, amenities and infrastructures.
- Enabling households who have obtained land rights to improve their housing.
- Mainstreaming through participatory planning and Governance through which slum dwellers can participate in making plans for their own settlements.

Odisha won the "World Habitat Award", global recognition of its ambitious unique initiative Jaga Mission. This award is given by World Habitat, UK- based organization, in Partnership with United Nation (UN) habitat, every year, in recognition of innovative, outstanding, revolutionary ideas, projects and programs from across the world.

Government of Odisha and Tata Trusts were awarded "India Geospatial Excellence Award" for

technological innovation in Odisha Land Rights & Jaga Mission programme by Geo Smart India.







1.3.10. Zero Hunger- AAHAAR

Objective of the AAHAAR programme is to provide subsidised meal to needy people in urban areas at an affordable cost of Rs. 5/- only in a dignified environment. The programme helps to alleviate hunger in a significant manner which is appreciated by urban poor. Nearly 1 lakh hot cooked meals are being served daily through 167 Aahaar Kendras present across 115 ULBs. Meal services are extended at night in 58 Aahaar Kendras located near hospitals to cater to the need

of patients and their attendants. All the 167 Aahaar Kendras and all 38 Central Aahaar Kitchens have received ISO Certification for their quality of practice. Mission Shakti Women Self Help Groups (MS-WSHG) are entrusted for operation and management of all the 167 Aahaar Kendras. 36 MS-WSHGs are directly



associated with the operation and management of Central Aahaar Kitchens and 107 Aahaar Kendras as Implementing Partners. Initiatives have been taken to set-up 55 new Aahaar Kitchens and handing over of operation and management of all the kitchens to MS-WSHGs.

1.3.11. Dindayal Antodaya Yojana- National Urban Livelihood Mission (DAY-NULM):Urban Livelihood.

The DAY-NULM objective is to reduce poverty and volunerability of the urban poor household by enabling them to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, resulting in an appreciable improvement in their livelihoods on a sustainable basis. The Mission addressed the livelihood concerns of the urban street vendors by facilitating access to suitable spaces, institutional credit, social security and skills for accessing emerging market opportunities. It also aims at providing shelter equipped with essential services to the urban homeless in a phased manner. The programme has major six components. Social Mobilization & Institutional Development, Employment through Skill Training & Placement, Self-employment Programme, Capacity Building & Training, Shelter for Urban homeless and support to Urban Street Vendors.

Under SM & ID component, a total of 35604 number of SHG groups have been formed i.e 1473 SHGs formed during 21 – 22 & all SHGs have opened their Bank Accounts for Financial Inclusion. Till date19765 SHGs have been trained & 21580 SHGs have been given with Revolving Funds i.e 1513 SHGs for the year 21 – 22. Further so far 584 ALFs have been provided with RF i.e 198 ALFs for the year 21 – 22. An amount of INR 24.5 crore has been spent so far under SM&ID component, including INR 2.51 crore for the year 21 – 22. Under Self Employment Programme(SEP), till date 16276 individuals & 2072 groups have been provided with loans i.e 2153 individuals & 530 groups for the year 21 – 22. So far 15370 SHGs have availed loans under SHG Bank linkage i.e 4347 for the year 21 – 22. Till date 44 Shelters for Urban Homeless (SUH)





Centers have been operationalized. Altogether, the survey of 114 towns has been completed and 101004 nos. of street vendors have been identified that includes approximately 52000 LoRs approved for Street Vendors newly identified during the Covid period. Out of which 34, 745 Street Vendors have been issued ID cards & Certificate of Vending Zone has been issued to 26,468 Street Vendors and till date 34,314 no of Street Vendors have been provided with Cumulative no of loans under PM SVANidhi programme.

1.3.12. Unnati:

For addressing the critical gaps and creation of sustainable community assets like smart parks

and model crematoriums for making cities liveable and loveable an investment of ¹ 200 crores was sanctioned. For urban transformation 114 smart parks and an equal number of model crematoriums are proposed to be constructed across Urban Odisha. This scheme aims at uniformity in modernized transformation of Urban Odisha.



1.3.13. Revenue Enhancement of Urban Local Bodies:

Increase in Holding / Property Tax Collection – up from Rs. 58.48cr. in FY15-16 to Rs.104.38cr. in FY18-19 and Rs.144.30cr. in FY19-20, Increase in non-tax revenues/other Revenue – up from Rs.140.30cr. in FY 15-16 to Rs.158.70cr. in FY 18-19 and Rs.173.66cr. in FY20-21. Increase in own sources of revenue – up from Rs.198.79cr. in FY 15-16 to Rs. 263cr. in FY 18-19 and Rs. 317.96 cr. in FY19-20. Total 60000 Properties outside the Property Tax base identified leveraging GIS Technology, Property Tax demand unlocked per annum due to strengthened enforcement function. Implementation of web based online Public Financial Management Systems for Fund Management and e-Payments in 110 ULBs. Revenue realized from all 114 ULBs in 2019-20 was Rs. 317 cr. Own Source of Revenue collection for the FY 21-22. Holding Tax/Property Tax Collection-Rs. 13911.63 Lakhs. Other Revenue Collection-Rs. 22324. 69 Lakhs. Total collection-Rs. 36236.31 lakhs.

1.3.14. Government Interventions, Plans & Policies

- Odisha is one of the leading States in the Country for initiating various urban reforms with an aim to improve service delivery, mobilize resources, transparent municipal functioning and accountability of functionaries.
- Government has adopted the principle of 5Ts (Transparency, Technology, and Team Work, Time Limit & Transformation) to bring about spectacular change in the Administration and Service delivery.
- Trade License, Certificates are issued on "Demand Approval Basis" instantly.
- Marriage Certificate are issued on the same day of personal appearance of the Couple for Marriage Registration.





- ❖ In coordination with H & F. W. Department, efforts are made to issue Birth & Death Certificate as same day service on-line basis.
- All citizen services like water supply connection, sewerage connection and cesspool services will be integrated and a common on-line application will be developed for providing service on ANY TIME ANY WHERE BASIS.
- Certificates will be issued without pre-verification on the basis of "Trust & Issue Principle".
 Unique address will be given to every house by digital door numbering along with new ID for each street.
- Collection of Property Tax/ Holding Tax will be streamlined through on-line as well as through outsourcing agency.
- On-line Building plan approval system will be implemented throughout the State
- Government has shifted its focus from centralized treatment of solid waste management to decentralized micro composting system involving Women Self Help Group (WSHG) as "Swachha Sathi".
- To manage urban expansion and improve socio-economic activities through a structured process, the Bhubaneswar Development Authority started State's first ever Town Planning Scheme through land pooling.
- The Jalasathi initiative was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha to facilitate effective water management through participation of the community at the ward level i.e. SHG members as Jalasathis.
- Amnesty Scheme for regularization of unauthorized constructions- with an intent to bring all the unplanned areas or unauthorized layout into the fold of plan development and to address the issue of building permission on the sub-divided plots.

1.3.15. Special Achievement:

Odisha has retained its first position in the Country in 2020-21 in effective implementation of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) scheme.







CHAPTER-2

Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (OUIDF)

2.1. Vision & Mission

Vision

The Vision of OUIDF is to be a sustainable financial intermediary that enhances the flow of private capital to urban sector in Odisha and facilitate Urban Local Bodies to become capable and sustainable organisations, sensitive to stake holders in providing the highest quality of Urban Services.

Mission

The Mission of OUIDF is to contribute to improvement in urban quality of life in Odisha by facilitating efficient Urban Infrastructure Asset Creation and Provision of Urban Service through Innovative & self sustainable Projects.

2.1. OBJECTIVE

In line with the Policy Guidelines enunciated by the Union Government, Government of Odisha (GoO) has also focused on development of urban infrastructure. This is expected to meet the rising demand for urban amenities keeping in pace with the rapid growth in urban population as well as to successfully manage the huge challenges and opportunities arising out of such rapid urbanisation. Urban Infrastructure Projects such as Slum Rehabilitation through Affordable Housing, Cost Effective Water Supply, Comprehensive Sewerage Systems, Sanitation, Solid Waste Management, and various Climate Adoption Measures contribute to improvement of the environment as well as provide a better quality of life for the Urban Poor. The State Government has therefore placed utmost importance on the balanced and planned growth of cities and towns with adequate infrastructure and basic amenities through Urban Local Bodies and other Agencies. With this back drop, the Government of Odisha, with assistance from KfW, Germany has set up a Trust, the Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (OUIDF) for the purpose of developing and financing Eco-Friendly Infrastructure Projects undertaken by Urban Local Bodies, Statutory Bodies, Public Sector Undertakings of the State and Private Investors and attracts inter alia, investment and professional advice from Institutions for financing Infrastructure Projects.





- The primary objective of creating OUIDF is to progressively increase external financing of ULB level capital projects in a sustainable manner, in a non-guarantee mode. Creation of OUIDF, as part of an over- arching Urban Development Programme, would enable this through;
- Catalysing Development of Well-Structured Bankable Projects;
- Capacity Building for Project conceptualization, development and implementation; and
- Facilitating / Sensitising State and ULB level reforms that can be pre-cursors for further investment flows.

The focus of OUIDF's charter includes the followings:

- To provide Financial Assistance to the various executing agencies like Urban Local Bodies, Statutory Bodies, Public Sector Undertakings and Private Investors in the form of long-term low-cost Debt along with Viability Grant, for setting up sustainable positive environment impact Infrastructure Projects in the State of Odisha.
- To provide required hand-holding support to the executing agencies for procurement as per international guidelines adopting a fair and transparent procurement system.
- To provide long term debt or take equity position in the Infrastructure Projects sponsored by Private Investors on a commercial basis when the Infrastructure Projects are considered strategically important.
- To become financially self-sustainable and to mobilise sources (including private and capital market) to finance Urban Infrastructure Development.
- To provide Grant Support to the executing agencies for Project Development, preparation of Detailed Project Report as well as Project Monitoring / Management & Consultancy Services.

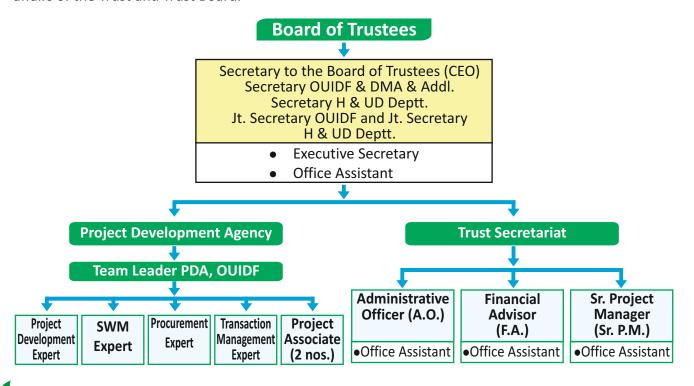

2.3. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF OUIDF

The OUIDF, has been set up as a Trust (under the Indian Trust Act, 1882) under H&UD Deptt. having a Board of Trustees, which will define the "Funds Charter and Disbursement Guidelines." The Chairperson and the Members of the Board of Trustees have been nominated by GoO. The Trust came into existence vide Govt. Notification No. 2709, date: 31.01.2012 and Registered Trust Deed dated: 20.03.2013. The Board of Trustees are as under:

CHAPTER-3

Support from Government of Germany through KfW

3.1. KfW Lines of Credit

3.1.1. 1st Line of Credit

As a part of Financial Cooperation between Government of India and Government of Federal Republic of Germany, KfW provided Euro 50 million as Loan and Euro 2.5 million as Technical Assistance Grant to Government of India. The Loan & Financing Agreements were executed on 02.08.2012.

Government of India channelised the above Funds through GoO to OUIDF to pass 50% of the Fund (i.e., Euro 25 million) as a Capital Grant to ULBs through Grant Support Fund of OUIDF and the remaining 50% as Loan through the Urban Loan Fund of OUIDF. Technical Assistance Grant was passed on to the Project Development Fund of OUIDF.

Accordingly, GoO & OUIDF executed further two Agreements (Project & Separate Agreements) with KfW and availed the assistance from KfW under the 1st Line of Credit, details of which are given below:

Similarly, the Project Agreement and Separate Agreement were signed with Government of Odisha in the presence of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Odisha on 19th December' 2017 to avail assistance of Euro 55 million as Loan and Euro 2 million as Technical Assistance as follows:

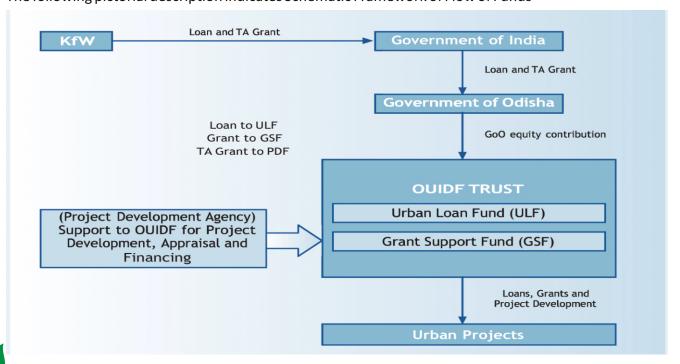
In the 2nd Line of Credit the under noted Targeted Outcomes are envisaged:

- Achieve better Quality of Life of targeted population by creating infrastructure for clean and healthy environment.
- Access to Improved Recreation and Public Green Spaces for inhabitants.
- LED Street Lighting Projects to create Safe Streets and achieve higher Energy Savings.

It is expected that the Projects proposed under 2nd Line of Credit, spread across Odisha, would benefit 7 million urban population of the State.

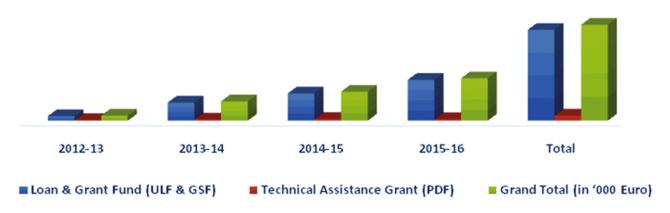

3.4. Financial Assistance Frame Work of OUIDF

The Financial Assistance Framework of OUIDF consists of an Urban Loan Fund (the "Loan Fund"), Grant Support Fund (the"Grant Fund") and Project Development Fund (the"PDF"). A Project Development Agency has been set up to assist in management of the Funds and is responsible for Project identification, development, appraisal, disbursement, follow-up and monitoring of Urban Infrastructure Projects in Odisha. The PDA assist in Management of three Funds under the OUIDF Trust as described below:

Urban Loan Fund (ULF) & Grant Support Fund (GSF): Urban Loan Fund (ULF) and Grant Support Fund (GSF) have been set up to provide Loans to Urban Projects on an Non-guaranteed mode.

- 1st Line of Credit Euro 25 Mn say Rs.200cr. each and
- 2nd Line of Credit Euro 27.5 Mn say Rs.220cr. each

Project Development Fund (PDF): The PDF has a corpus of Euro 2.5 million & Euro 2.0 million under the 1st and 2nd Line of Credit respectively. The Objectives of the Project Development Fund are given below:

Establishment and Institutional built-upand capacity building of the OUIDF/Asset Management Company (AMC).





- Development of the Environment Climate Change and Social Framework (ECSF) of the OUIDF.
- Development of lending policies, procedures, processes and operational almanuals and other documents necessary for operation of the Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund.
- Development of innovative financial products (pooled financing and capital market mechanisms) and PPP structures.
- Project preparation support to the ULBs and State Level Agencies (detailed project reports, project design studies, tendering and implementation process etc.).
- Capacity Building support to the ULBs, Development Authorities, Regional Improvement Trusts, Special Planning Authorities, Odisha State Housing Board and Statutory Boards.
- The activities funded out of PDF also comprise the following:
- Project Identification and Development of Bankable Projects.
- The focus of the PDF is to extend assistance from Concept to Commissioning of Projects viz., the Preparation of City Development Plans, Pre-Feasibility Studies and Detailed Project Reports, Transaction Advisory Support, Project Monitoring and Consultancy during implementation, etc.
- Conducting Workshops and visits for Capacity Building by Resource Persons of the Executing Agencies as well as OUIDF.
- Empanelment of Consultants for Eco-friendly Infrastructure Projects in various sectors.

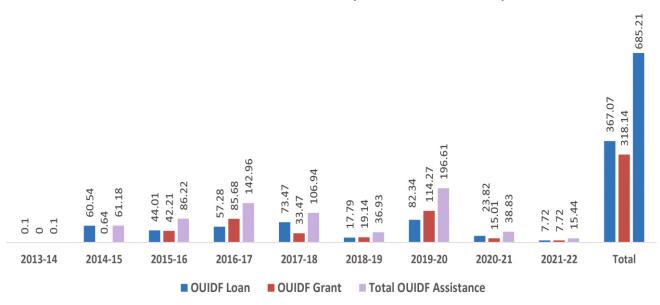

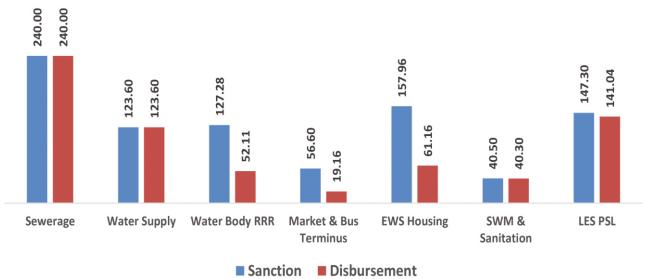

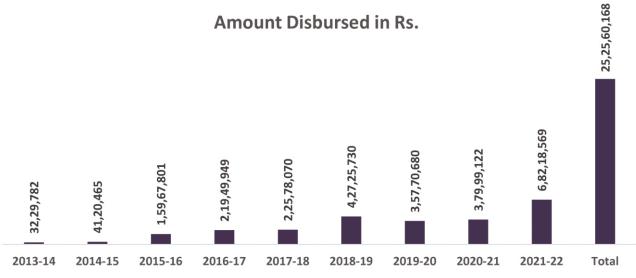
4.5. Project Development Fund

CHAPTER-5

New Projects – Approval

The details of the Projects sanctioned by the Board of Trustees of OUIDF during the Financial Year 2020-21 & 2021-22 are as follows:

5.1. Reclamation and Peripheral Development of 3 Water Bodies in 3 ULBs namely – Subarnapur, Pattamundai & Digapahandi Municipalities.

Water Bodies are useful sources for daily water needs of people residing in water scarce areas. One of the very important role played by any Water Body is recharging of ground water. The Water Bodies trap and store rainwater and other surface flows from streams etc. and recharge the ground water to a very considerable extent. Water Bodies also play a very vital role in maintaining the ecological balance. Deterioration of Water Bodies cause ecological imbalance as well as health hazards to the local population.

The above mentioned 3 Water Bodies are located in 3 ULBs namely – Subarnapur, Pattamundai & Digapahandi Municipalities. The basic objective is to conserve, restore, develop and manage these sustainably for better ecosystem, aesthetic and environmental purpose.

The core reclamation components proposed for these Water Bodies include dewatering, deweeding, desilting and embankment construction. Peripheral components include pathway with hand railing along the periphery of the tanks, fencing, light posts, installation of benches and garbage bins, construction of new bathing ghats and renovation of existing bathing ghats. Additionally, Community Toilets along with bathing facilities are also proposed along the banks of each of the Water Body.

Bio-Mining has been successfully deployed in various cities for management of Legacy Municipal Waste and Reclamation of Land. SBM in its Advisory on Landfill Reclamation has recommended Bio-Mining/Bio-Remediation for clearing the dumpsites.

Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation has been using the Bhuasuni dumpsite for the last 10-12 years for dumping of mixed waste on about 60 acres land parcel. The dumpsite is situated near to Chandaka Forest and near to city boundary even though they were originally in the outskirts. The Bhuasuni dumpsites have neither a lining nor a daily covering and receive mixed and untreated waste which has a large organic fraction. These open dumpsites pose serious health risks such as ground water pollution caused by leachate seeping into the ground, air pollution, vector borne diseases, hazardous landfill fires, and unaesthetic appearance.

In addition to the environmental losses, these dumpsites cause social and economic losses to the nearby people due to the stigma around dumpsites. All these issues necessitate the remediation of dumpsites in a scientific manner. The problem of dump sites being in the middle of cities is particularly troublesome for metro cities, where the large quantities of waste result in large plots of useful land being wasted as dumpsites.

Since there is a dire need to reclaim the land and utilise it for projects to be identified at a later stage, BMC had carried out a Study through KIIT University for the estimation and quanlification of Garbage at and around the dump yard. As per the Report submitted by KIIT University Team, the estimated quantity of waste already collected at landfill is around 16 (sixteen) lakh MT.

BMC has proposed to implement the Bio-Mining Project immediately for Management of Legacy Municipal Waste and prevent further ecological imbalance in the area.



Status of Approved Projects

The Progress of implementation of the Projects sanctioned by the Board of Trustees of OUIDF is reviewed regularly by the Principal Secretary, H&UD Dept. in the Monthly Review Meetings and in other Project-Specific Meetings. Review Meetings have been held regularly with all concerned stakeholders in order to improve the monitoring mechanism and execution of Projects with in budgeted costs and approved time lines.

Project Development & Capacity Building Initiatives

During last Financial Years 2020-21 and 2021-22, the focus of OUIDF included the following:

- To broad base its activities across the State, covering all Urban Local Bodies by promoting Projects conforming to the plans and priorities of the Union as well as the State Govt., such as Retro-fitting and Greenfield Energy Efficient Public Street Lighting, Reclamation and Restoration of Water Bodies Bio-Mining of Legacy Waste etc.
- OUIDF has extended hand holding support to the ULBs for Project Development, Bid Process Management as well as for effective implementation of the Projects. Accordingly, it has appointed Consultants as well as Transaction Advisors for preparation of Detailed Project Reports, Bid Process Management and to extend Project Management / Consultancy Support.

The key achievements of OUIDF in this regard during FY 2020-21 and 2021-22 are given below:

7.1. **Assistance in Bid Process Management & Project Monitoring**

7.1.1. Project Monitoring Support

Odisha Urban Infrastructure Development Fund

7.1.1.1. Energy Efficient Street Lighting Project (Retro-fitting) in 5 Municipal Corporations on PPP basis

M/s Price Water House Coopers Pvt. Ltd. have been appointed as Independent Engineer for the above Project being implemented in the 5 Municipal Corporations at Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Berhampur, Sambalpur and Rourkela for a revised Total Project Cost of Rs. 75.61 crore. The Project is being monitored by OUIDF and Independent Engineer on regular basis. The following activities have been performed by OUIDF;

- P Regular Monitoring of Projects through WhatsApp Groups, Field Visits and Review Meetings with ULBs.
- Flagging critical issues and bottlenecks hampering progress of Projects.
- Follow up on billing and payments to Contractors and reducing the time line for payment cycle.

7.1.1.2. Integrated Municipal Solid Waste Management Project, Berhampur

M/s InfraEn (India) Pvt. Ltd. was appointed as Independent Engineer for the 150 TPD MSW Project at Mahuda, Berhampur undertaken by Berhampur Municipal Corporation involving a Project Cost of Rs. 44.44 crore with Financial Assistance of OUIDF amounting to Rs. 40 crore. The Project is being monitored by OUIDF, Berhampur Municipal Corporation and Independent Engineer on regular basis.



7.1.1.3. Water Body Reclamation at Berhampur

M/s WAPCOS Ltd. was appointed as Construction Supervision Consultant for the Reclamation and Renovation activities for the Ramalingeshwar Tank Phase-I and Phase-II involving a Project Cost of Rs. 9.03 crore. The Projects are being monitored by OUIDF and Independent Engineer on regular basis.

7.1.1.4. Reclamation & Peripheral Development of Water Bodies across 27 ULBs

The Board of Trustee of OUIDF in the 12th Meeting advised OUIDF to take up about 100-125 Water Bodies spread across various ULBs in the State. The basic objective was to undertake Reclamation, Rejuvenation and Development of Water Body Projects especially in water scarce regions of Western Odisha as well as large ULBs and Municipal Corporation of the State.

Accordingly, a survey was conducted with the direction from H&UD Deptt. regarding available Water Bodies with Municipal Corporations, Municipalities and N.A.Cs and development need for the purpose.

The basic objectives were: The Water Body Projects act as source of drinking water, recharge ground water support bio-diversity and provide livelihood opportunities to a large number of people. Further, these Projects have important role in maintaining and restoring the ecological balance.

In order to achieve the goal of revival of Water Bodies, the following interventions have been proposed, depending on the purpose, ecological services, livelihood and socio-cultural practices. The approach will vary from one to another.

Proposed Interventions:-

- Dewatering / De-Weeding / De-Silting
- Strengthening of Embankments Strengthening including Stone Packing, Construction of Retaining Wall & Toe Wall.
- Prevention of Discharge of Waste Water.
- Proper Outlet
- Periphery Development including Pathways / Landscaping / Benches & Lighting
- Community Toilets
- Provision for Bathing Ghats

In order to facilitate the process and to provide support for the ULBs, the identified Water Bodies (93 Nos.) in 27 ULBs have been divided into 4 Clusters and the following Consultants have been appointed to render Project Management Consultancy support to the ULBs.



- M/s Multi Mantech International Pvt. Ltd., Ahmedabad, Gujarat.
- M/s Planning Solutions, Vadodara, Gujarat.
- M/s WAPCOS Ltd., New Delhi.

As regards, Reclamation and Peripheral Development of Water Bodies, 27 ULBs evinced interest for preparation of DPR and Project Monitoring Support for the above purpose. The Projects are being monitored by OUIDF and our Consultants on regular basis.

7.2. Initiative for Reclamation of Water Bodies

Rapid urbanization and change of lifestyles require more public open spaces in cities to fulfill different socio, economic and environmental needs of city population. It is therefore necessitated to restore/ develop the degraded Water Bodies to facilitate their intended use as fresh water storage bodies and to improve health, hygiene, aesthetic and recreational value of the Water Bodies. In Odisha, especially western and southern part water scarcity of various localities in the Urban Areas and also the need arising out of recharges of the Water Bodies, H&UD Dept. has formulated a policy for development of these Water Bodies into a public space.

Focus is given to facilitate ground water discharge to overcome the problem of water scarcity & to prevent water pollution due to drain/waste water discharge into the Water Body. Currently, many Water Bodies are being taken up for the purpose of reclamation, renovation and peripheral development under the jurisdiction of ULBs with the financial assistance of OUIDF in shape of Loan and Grant as well as funding support of OMBADC.

Further, many a Water Bodies in the District Headquarters ULBs have not been taken up for various reasons which are of prime importance. It has therefore been decided that, at least one Water Body at each District Headquarter ULB will be taken up for development as Public Place Model Water Body with financial support of OUIDF/ State Government. The Model Water Body should have recreational facilities for use by public, with components like dewatering, desilting, embankment, strengthening along with peripheral development in the peripheral areas viz. walking track, street furniture, lighting, greenery, toilet complex etc. As of now Model Water Body Proposals have been received from most of the districts which are in different stages of approval.

7.3. Energy Efficient Street Lighting Project (Greenfield) in 114 ULBs on PPP mode

M/s Deloitte Touché Tohmatsu has been appointed as the Transaction Advisor for the Project involving a Project Cost of Rs. 264.52 crore and with Financial Assistance of OUIDF amounting to Rs. 79.36 crore.

The role of the Transaction Advisor includes Technical Due Diligence, Tender Documentation,
 Bid Process Management and Transaction Implementation along with assistance during the





installation phase through Supervision, Project Monitoring and issuance of Certificate of Installation and Commissioning of Equipment for 114 ULBs of the State spread across the 5 Clusters.

The Project is further monitored on daily basis by the State Monitoring Cell (Smart LED) set up at OUIDF through the following activities:

- Daily monitoring of Progress though Cluster-specific WhatsApp Groups, Field Visits and Review
- Meetings with the ULBs and Implementing Agencies.
- Flagging critical issues and bottlenecks hampering the progress of the Project at concerned ULB and its resolution through interventions at appropriate levels.

7.4. Other Project Monitoring Activities

OUIDF assisted Sambalpur Municipal Corporation (SMC) in tendering, evaluation and award of

This programme is under implementation over a period of 5 years i.e. from 2015-16 to 2019-20. AMRUT Mission Statement & Guidelines provide for creation of a Financial Intermediary in order to pool funds from all sources and release funds to ULBs in time. Such intermediaries will also be able to access external sources of finance, such as debt and bonds, which small and financially distressed ULBS are unable to access. Accordingly, it has been decided that OUIDF will act as Financial Intermediary for implementation of AMRUT Scheme in Odisha in order to pool funds from all sources and release the same to the Executing Agencies / ULBs in time.

Hence, OUIDF as Financial Intermediary, is maintaining the AMRUT Account of the State Mission Director. The Executing Agencies are given Limits under PFMS Portal every month and have access to the Mission Director's Account as per the Allocated Limits. All the Books of Accounts, Records, Vouchers, etc. are maintained at OUIDF Office. As of now 191 Nos. of AMRUT Projects have been implemented in the State which are in various stages, with a total disbursement of Rs. 1607.64 Crs. up to 31st March' 2022 with completion of 177 Projects.

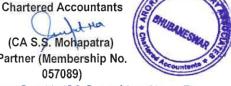

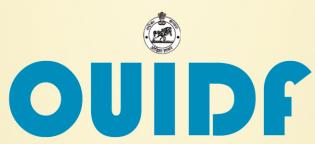
